Best Practice:

Membership/Publicity

From numerous clubs the advice is to walk and walk often. Rather than relying on Traditional Events, frequently held on weekends, clubs offer weekly walks. Using Year Round Event (YRE) routes, groups meet on a specified day and time (10:00 am Wednesday or 6:00 pm Thursday—the latter to accommodate those working full-time) to walk and socialize. The Sacramento Walking Sticks even have walks on evenings when the moon is full! The Freestate Happy Wanderers encourage each Point of Contact (POC) to sponsor a group walk of their YRE when regular events are not scheduled. During summer, The Tahoe Trail Trekkers have two walks a week that bring in vacationers. Each walk is hosted and led by a different club member.

We are walking clubs, so do more of what we do best: Walk!

Special Programs -- 2018

At each January NEC Meeting, new Special Programs are introduced for review and approval by the NEC to begin in the following year. In January 2017, the Special Programs will be introduced which, if approved, would start up on January 1, 2018

Any club considering a new Special Program must have all the documentation sent to your Regional Director and to the Special Program Committee Chair, Bonnie Johnson by <u>November 1, 2016</u>. The documents must include a colored copy of the patch and its dimensions, a mock up booklet with your particular Special Program rules and qualifiers. An expense report with a minimum order of 100 patches, postage and printing for a cost estimation to support your program must also be attached. Please check the AVA website under: Administration, Publications-Policies, AVA Policy Manual 4.05 for the information and procedures in hosting an AVA Special Program.

National Distance Program Update:

First the good news. I went to Wisconsin, and tagged along with their RD, Jerry Wilson, as he investigated possible trails for the new Ice Age Trail National Program which will start in 2017 (walking will start when the snow melts in the spring). They are getting a ton of help from the Ice Age Trail Alliance, who have done a fabulous job mapping their 1,000 mile plus trail. Along with a good friend and avid walker, Susan Weston, Jerry and I walked the Devil's Lake State Park trail (gorgeous views of the lake), and parts of the Kettle Moraine State Forest Northern Unit. They have over 30 miles of well marked trails. Next we walked the Merrimac Ferry to Gibraltar Point trail. A very nice walk in the woods, followed by an uphill trail to the top of Gibraltar Point. The views were incredible. We also saw a flock of wild turkeys using the trail!

Next, I am reporting a one year delay of the launch of the Pacific Crest Trail, originally scheduled to open on 1 Jan 2017. Turns out it's easier to build a program in a single state; taking on the entire west coast of America is a much more demanding task. But we will have some Pacific Crest Trails available for you to walk in 2017once the snow melts, and you will be able to receive credit for them in the Online Walk Box under the Pacific Crest Trail program.

Strategic Planning - Next Steps

The Strategic Plan was approved by the National Executive Council on June 11, 2016. The next step will be the implementation of key strategies outlined in the plan based on prioritization of organizational needs and the availability of resources.

The tasks associated with implementation of the plan have been assigned to existing committees and members of the NEC with the exception of the formation of two new ad hoc committees, the membership committee and the fund development committee. The membership committee will be Chaired by Jeanne Miller who also served as the North Central representative on the Strategic Planning Committee. The fund development committee will be Chaired by Nancy Wittenberg, Northwest Regional Director.

The Youth Committee was also renamed and restructured as the "programs committee" which will now encompass the development and enhancement of *all* AVA domestic programs to include youth and not to be confused with AVA's International and Nationwide programs which is Chaired by Susan Medlin or AVA's Special Programs which is Chaired by Bonnie Johnson. The emphasis of the programs committee will be to look at new programs for the AVA.

All AVA employees will be assigned to work with these committees throughout the implementation process.

Chairpersons of key areas of implementation of the plan include the following:

Strategic Goal 1: Mission Advancement – Key responsibilities have been assigned to the Executive Committee Chaired by Dennis Michele, the National Programs Committee Chaired by Susan Medlin, the newly formed Membership Committee Chaired by Jeanne Miller, the Programs Committee Chaired by Debbie Kruep, and the Training Committee Chaired by Sam Korff.

Strategic Goal 2: Financial Sustainability – Key responsibilities have been assigned to Nancy Wittenberg who is Chair of the Fund Development Committee and the Executive Director. Susan Medlin will also be supporting this committee.

Strategic Goal 3: Internal Operations – Key responsibilities have been assigned to the Internet Technology Committee Chaired by Frank Sayers, the Executive Committee Chaired by Dennis Michele and the Executive Director.

Strategic Goal 4: Governance & Leadership – Key responsibilities have been assigned to the Bylaws Committee Chaired by Jerry Wilson, the Standards and Evaluation Committee Chaired by Suzi Glass and the Executive Committee Chaired by Dennis Michele.
