#### THE AVA RECOGNITION AWARDS PROGRAM

The AVA Recognition Awards Program was established in 1985 to honor individuals, clubs, and organizations, both within and without the AVA, for service, deeds and accomplishments which have advanced the ideals and aspirations of volkssporting in the United States.

There are four categories of Recognition Awards:

#### 1. AVA Hall of Fame Award

The Hall of Fame Award may be bestowed upon individuals who have given at least five years of service to the AVA at the national, state, and local levels and who have made exceptional contributions to volkssporting which have affected several AVA Regions.

# 2. AVA Distinguished Achievement Award

The Distinguished Achievement Award may be bestowed upon individuals who have given at least five years of service to the AVA at the national, state or local level and who have made outstanding contributions to volks-sporting in the United States or in their AVA Regions.

# 3. AVA Meritorious Service Award

The Meritorious Service Award may be bestowed upon individuals who have rendered significant service which contributed to the enhancement of volkssporting.

## 4. AVA Certificate of Service

Certificates of Service may be bestowed upon individuals, clubs or organizations who have made significant contributions to volkssporting in the United States. Eligibility for a Certificate of Service is achieved either by nomination or by service on a national committee.

Recognition Awards are presented at the AVA Biennial Convention Awards Banquet.

Nominations for Recognition Awards may be made by AVA member clubs, state organizations or members of the AVA Executive Council. Each nomination is reviewed by the appropriate Regional Director and then forwarded to the Recognition Awards Committee. After reviewing all of the nominations in each category, the Committee makes its recommendations to the Executive Council and they make the final determinations.

Many thanks to the numerous clubs, state organizations, and individual volkssporters who noticed when someone was doing an outstanding job, and then took the time to nominate them for a Recognition Award. Thank you, also, to the Recognition Awards Committee, which had the cumbersome job of reviewing each nomination and making their recommendations to the Executive Council. And finally, thank you to EC VI for the very difficult task of reviewing, carefully considering, and voting on each of the committee's recommendations.

Congratulations to each recipient of a 1991 AVA Recognition Award! Each of you has worked hard to make a significant contribution to volkssporting and to encourage healthy, non-competitive recreation across our country. We not only recognize you, we applaud your dedication and thank you for your enthusiasm.
