IT Committee—Chris Zegelin, Chair

There always appears to be a lot going on with IT. We are cleaning up problems and making progress with the new member portal (my.ava.org). If you haven't tried this yet, you can now log in using your legacy club login, and modify the text on your 2019 stamps.

From "Club Home", select "Sanctions", followed by "Stamps". You can modify the text of any stamp that has not yet been manufactured. Once manufactured, the text is locked. HQ can still modify the text, and manufacture another stamp, but there will be a cost associated with that service.

Stamps are manufactured in a batch to keep the cost low. A batch might be 6 weeks worth of stamps. This of course has to be made at least 4 weeks before the first stamp in the batch is due to allow for mailing and the club getting the stamp to the right place. This is why it continues to be important to sanction events at least 12 weeks (3 months) ahead of time. The cost of the stamp rubber is all in the setup and shut down of the equipment (labor). The cost of the rubber is pennies. A single emergency stamp can cost as much as 100 stamps made in a manufacturing run.

Stamp handles are made by volunteers. Please treat them well and appreciate the San Antonio clubs and individuals that help keep the cost to AVA low. Please do not ask for more handles than you need, and please reuse them whenever possible. We will be sending additional handles with your 2019 YRE stamps. This will allow you to put the assembled 2019 stamp in the start box before the end of 2018, and then retrieve the 2018 stamp some time in January. You will need to keep the 2018 handle for use in 2020. (Note that you can now sanction a YRE for the full year, since you will no longer need a rush stamp shuffle day, on Jan 1).

We are starting to operate from a new sanction database. This is a copy of the legacy database with some modifications. There are additional fields such as those needed for the stamps, and new features that we are developing. This "copy" happens continuously in the background, but is far from instant. We have made improvements to get the average copy time down to less than 1 hour, but if there is a rush of changes, then it might take a day. This is important to you because if you make an emergency change to the sanction, it might take a day for this change to become visible. Let us know about these emergencies.

This new database is allowing us to work towards a replacement for the current "find a club", and "find an event" tools. This replacement will occur in the next two months. The new design is more informative and easier to use. The navigation between events and clubs is easier. They will simplify the sanctioning of an event on the Online Start Box (OSB), and other benefits.

The difficult one is the interactive map. The current design uses very old Google tools that will loose "support" by the end of this year. I timed the current load time, and it took over 8 minutes to load the information for one state. This is solely between your browser and Google using Javascript, the AVA server is not involved. The only way we can "fix" this is to rewrite the interactive map using the latest from Google. This has begun, but it is yet another huge task. We will not turn off the old interactive map until we have a good replacement.

The goal is to get to a trip planning tool. As we look at this, we find that too many of the event database entries simply won't work. We use web services such as Google for mapping and rely on them to resolve a location based on the information that you put into the sanction. They do a pretty good job, but when our information does not conform to their expectations, the location is incorrect, and your event will not be found.

Similarly, some entries overload fields like the event city with lots of extra information. The Legacy ESR does not protect against this, but when it is displayed on a phone, the entry is unreadable. IT cannot fix any of this, it will be up to you to correct your sanction entries. IT will provide you with the tools to understand what you need to do.

With a little over a year of work, I see reasonable progress. We are all volunteers who collectively have provided more than \$150,000 worth of consulting work to AVA gratis. We will continue to focus on the most important tasks like a long term solution to convention management. All of this work has to happen while we continue to operate. It's like finishing a plane while the shell is flying along...

We would also like to hear from you. (IT@ava.org) I went back through the 2011 IT survey and have tried to incorporate many of those ignored requests into our current work. Improvements to the current legacy ESR is #1. The member portal coupled with a better interface to AVA is #2. Full support for phones and tablets is #3. Try the new portal on your phone. The buttons are bigger and easier to use with touch, and the display works for portrait or landscape. We are listening.

One of the unique features of the sport of volksmarching is the ability to certify lifetime achievements from walking thousands of kilometers of distance over thousands of events. For many AVA walkers, the numbers can be very impressive. Now volksmarchers have a way to publicly tout their achievements while providing a very public display that they participate in "America's Walking Club."

For many years, runners and other distance-covering sports have used the white oval with the numbers "26.2" or "13.1" to show that they covered that many miles in one event. Sometimes one can see an oval with "10K" on it. While those numbers might be significant for one certified event, the numbers certified

in the AVA Achievement Book can help us catch the eye of others. We now can display for all to see that "Collecting Kilometers is Cool!"

After an enquiry from the Wood & Dale Wanderers Club, the national staff of the AVA created new promotional items for the organization's page on the CafePress website with the white oval theme. These items include magnets, stickers and others that proudly display a dozen different lifetime distance

achievement levels. The numbers range from 500 to 50,000 kilometers. Inside the oval are words and the logo that show that the distance come through participation in the AVA. The magnets have two sizes and the stickers come with white or clear backgrounds.

Every item purchased from CafePress with the AVA logo raises money for the organization. The AVA wins with every sale made, and the purchaser wins the admiration and respect of every other athlete that sees the accomplishments from years of walking.

AVA's Executive Director's Update—Henry Rosales

AVA Community Events (ACE) will be ready for implementation October 1, 2018

ACE events are non-IVV events that were approved by the National Executive Council last September. This new brand of AVA events will support enhancement of our current IVV events by allowing clubs more flexibility to create events that are not restricted by IVV guidelines and more responsive to local community needs.

ACE Events fall into the following three classifications:

ACE-Y (Youth Community Events) – This type of event will cater to clubs who will be working with youth in the elementary, middle and high school environment. For example, a club may want to host a walk for an elementary school on their school grounds or at a park. Online accessibility of information will be limited to protect the identity and well-being of minors who will be participating.

ACE-T (Traditional Community Events) — This type of event is comparable to the traditional event clubs currently host with the exception that this type of event does not have to be designed according to IVV guidelines. Hopefully this will allow clubs more flexibility to customize community events in their regions where an IVV event is not possible due to constraints of IVV guidelines thus drawing more participation. An example of this type of event might be a traditional event whereby a club partners with a local nonprofit organization to host a walk that is less than 10 kilometers and books are not stamped.

ACE-WG (Weekday Guided Community Events) – These events are designed to encourage weekly participation on a *regular* basis. Fun walks, guided walks, meet ups, etc., are examples of events that could fall into this category. Individual maps will not be required so long as there is a guide on each walk and all participants follow the guide.

More information on the sanctioning process, event guidelines and fees will be in the September Checkpoint. Note because these events are not required to adhere to IVV guidelines, participants cannot receive IVV credit for attending any of these events. The IVV logo should not be represented on any AVA Community Events literature.
