National Award Nominations Due NOW

Nominations for the four AVA national awards (Hall of Fame, Distinguished Achievement, Trailblazer and Ted Ballman Youth) as well as IVV recognition are due to your Regional Director in November. Regional Directors must sign off on nominations and forward them to the Awards Chair by December 1. Check "Section 3: Recognition Awards" of the AVA Policy Manual for the criteria, description and procedure for each award. AVA National Award nominations are submitted on AVA Form 302, found under the Clubs tab, Clubs Only, AVA Club Forms on the AVA website.

Don't let those who have worked years at the club, state, regional and national level go unrecognized! Anyone may nominate a club for the Trailblazer award or an individual for the other three awards. Only current members of the NEC and paid employees of AVA are ineligible to receive awards.

2019 Election of National Officers

As we approach the AVA Convention in Albany, New York, in June of 2019, we must remember that we are also approaching the election of the national officers for the term from July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2021. Positions open are President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer.

This is when you as an AVA member choose to run for a national office. Look at yourself and the services you have provided to your club, state and region. Are you ready to stand up and say "Elect me. I am qualified to serve you as a National Officer." It is easy to sit back and criticize. This may be the time you step forward and make a difference.

One of the attachments to this Checkpoint is titled "Nominations for NEC Officer Candidate Elections". It explains the steps required to become a candidate.

Nominations for NEC Officer Candidate Elections

Nominations are now being accepted from candidates who seek to be national officers of the American Volkssport Association's (AVA) National Executive Council XXI: President, Vice President, Secretary, or Treasurer. Elections will take place by the AVA membership at the Albany, New York convention on June 14, 2019. Successful candidates will take office on July 1, 2019 and serve until June 30, 2021.

Step 1 in the process is for the candidate to submit a Letter of Intent by email no later than midnight (his/ her local time) Tuesday, December 11. The brief letter need only include: office being sought, candidate's name, official mailing address, phone number, and email address. Electronic submission of the letter goes to the chair, Tom Jackson at <u>nomina-tions@ava.org</u>. A confirmation of receipt will be sent via email, as well as an attachment of Election Guidelines for Officer Candidates. Late submission of the Letter of Intent will cease further consideration for Step 2 in the nomination process.

Step 2 is for the candidate to submit a Nomination Package, only by email, no later than midnight (his/her local time) Tuesday, December 18. The Package must contain two items: a biographical article for *The American Wanderer* of 500 words or less and a candidate photo. The biographical article should be submitted as a Word document. Computer software will be used to determine the "word count".

This bio should include reasons why you are a candidate for office and your goals. It should tell us what you hope to accomplish if elected. Electronic submission of the package goes to the chair, Tom Jackson at <u>nominations@ava.org</u>. A confirmation of receipt will be sent via email. Late submission of the package will cease further consideration in this process.

For those candidates who have met the timelines for submission, and whose narratives are deemed accurate, their papers will be forwarded to AVA Headquarters for publication in the January 2019 edition of *Checkpoint*. However, the Nominating Committee reserves the right to make contacts with persons to verify the accuracy of information provided (e.g. positions held or awards received). We will correct neither grammar nor spelling. Photos submitted will not be altered by the Committee. Neither the photo or bio will be returned.

Basically, what you submit is what the AVA membership will see except in two cases: if the information submitted is found to be in error or the word count exceeds 500 words. Erroneous information will be deleted. If word count exceeds the limit you will be notified to edit and resubmit your article. If you do not resubmit in time for publication, your article will be

edited to delete everything after the 500 word count. So, please be clear, concise and correct with your submission.

You are entitled to one complimentary bio article and one photograph in *TAW*. This is considered to be your nomination package. These articles will appear in the March 2019 issue of *TAW*, which will be printed and released on or about February 15, 2019. Any personal campaign advertisement that you place in *TAW* will be at the commercial ad rates.

You can begin campaigning for office only after the official slate of candidates has been announced in the January 2019 issue of *Checkpoint*.

Nominations may still be made from the floor at the convention.

You can put a document (one-two pages) and/or a promotional campaign item (such as a button, pen, or lanyard) in the convention registration package; however, this must be done by you or your committee members. It will not be done by the convention committee members. All campaigning must be conducted on a professional level.

Submitting Completed Achievement Books – Making the Process Easier

The NEC is trying to make the submittal of achievement books to the National Office easier and somewhat safer for Associate members.

- At the June 2018 NEC Meeting in Albany NY the NEC voted to allow AVA Associate members, which includes AVA Lifetime members, to be able to send in scans of their completed achievement books versus mailing the actual books. This is an added value to national associate members that helps to avoid the rare, but possible loss of completed AVA books in the US mail.

Associate members submitting scanned documents will need to make sure scans are complete and legible.

- With the June 2018 change for Associate members, the NEC voted during the October 16 electronic meeting to allow not only Associate members, but all AVA participants to cut and paste individual stamps from official insert pages (official hard copy insert pages and on-line start box (OLSB) insert pages) into their official AVA achievement books, including all books such as Events, Distance, National Programs, Regional Programs, and Special Programs books. This is an option open to all AVA walkers to allow them to have complete books by pasting or taping individual stamps from other official sources into official achievement books. Staples will not be allowed.

Associate members will be allowed to scan books containing cut and pasted stamps for submittal to the National Office for fulfillment. Participants not members of the national AVA will be able to mail completed books that include cut and pasted stamps through the mail for fulfillment.

Learning the OLSB. Try it! You may love it!

Twin State Volkssport Association (TSVA) is the only active club in Vermont and New Hampshire. Although we have only a core of active members, our goal is to provide walks of interest in both states for our visitors. Thus, TSVA has a great interest in utilizing the OLSB (On Line Start Box) to allow us to present more walks than our limited human resources could comfortably provide. This has been our first experience with OLSB, and while the experiment continues, here follows our thoughts to date on this wonderful new tool that the California Volkssport Association has provided for us.

The combined size of our twin states is some 19,000 square miles. We have only six people who actively assist us with our walks. This has made walk box maintenance a chore, as too few people are given too many tasks. We can tell you tales of driving hundreds of miles to replace start cards. Cost to volunteer, lots of time and gas money. Cost to club? Perhaps this is one reason we have so few willing to take on these tasks. Burn out is a real thing.

Enter the OLSB. With this tool, you upload directions to a walk once. You must still keep the walk instructions current, and can change them as needed. But now we can spend our time improving the walks rather than responding to box maintenance requests. All the business is done by the OLSB. Consequently, TSVA can bring back walks we enjoyed but closed because we couldn't maintain them. This gives our visitors diversity, and lightens the load of the volunteer. PPSF, the Per Participant Sanction Fee, also reduces the up front cost for sanctioning, which is recouped by participation. This also has been an incentive for a small club to have more walks which would not have been financially prudent previously.

In 2018 we have seven OLSB walks, five in VT and one each in Maine and NH. It has reduced volunteer time, and increased what we can offer. TSVA will have more OLSB walks in 2019, as it is working well for us as club. We have a few more walks than before, and our POCs have fewer emergency walk box calls.

The first hurdle for the individual volkssporter is signing up to use OLSB. It is time to do this! I decided to commit to 10 walks via OLSB, sending money into the my own event bank using a credit card. I chose one of our walks. The walk experience is unchanged. Afterwards I went back online to complete the transaction. The fee is sent to the club's account, and the AVA credit information is stored on an insert card, waiting for you to print it out. Each card holds up to eight events or distances. Special Programs are accommodated, and the insert cards are beautiful! Then I started looking at all the walks I could do with this new technology. I am ready to plan a few trips!

This is a sea change for the AVA. A paradigm shift, it you will. We are finally getting into the 21st century, with a technology upgrade we have needed for a long time. This is a boon to small clubs, and any club who wants to make walks available more easily for provider and consumer. Once you make that first step, you may find it is the way to go for many of your walks. Try it, you may love it!

Good Standing Policy and Deadlines - Convention 2019 – Albany, NY

As the anticipation continues to build for the 21st AVA Biennial Convention in Albany, New York, we want to make certain that each one of our AVA Clubs are eligible to vote at the Convention. To be eligible to vote, an AVA Club must be in "**Good Standing**" 45 days prior to the first membership meeting of the Convention.

With that in mind, below are some things to keep in mind that pertain to the AVA's Good Standing Policy and Membership Voting:

The Bylaws of the American Volkssport Association, Inc.

ARTICLE IV MEETINGS

4.3 Voting Rights. Each elected National Officer, Regional Director, State Organization and Regular Member Club that is in good standing forty-five days before the opening of the membership meeting shall be entitled to one vote on each matter submitted to a vote of the members. The Executive Director shall have no vote.

The American Volkssport Association Policy Manual

SECTION 2: MEMBERSHIP

2.01 TYPES AND APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP

I. GENERAL POLICIES

II. POLICY

A. Application for Membership. Policy changes effective July 1, 2014 for (new) applications.

1. Any organization or group of persons wanting to form a Regular Member Club must submit an AVA Form 201, Application for Club Membership, with the charter fee and the appropriate prorated portion of the annual dues, the organization or group will send the application through the State Organization (if applicable) and the appropriate Regional Director to the AVA National Office.

a) The proposed Member Club must, as a minimum:

- (1) Have an elected President, Vice President and Secretary/Treasurer;
- (2) Have an approved Constitution and/or Bylaws;
- (3) Have an established bank account in the club's name;
- (4) Submit, if eligible, an application for inclusion in the AVA's 501(c)(3) Group Tax- Exemption;
- (5) Have an Employer Identification Number (EIN) issued by the Internal Revenue Service.

(6) If (4) and (5) do not apply, the proposed Member Club will submit paperwork showing proof of coverage under some other non-profit organization.

Please be advised per the Membership policy stated above, all AVA member clubs must have three officers at a minimum.

2.03 STATUS AND STANDING

I. GENERAL

The status and standing of a Regular Member Club, and State Organization determine their rights and privileges.

II. POLICY

A. Regular Member Clubs and State Organizations are considered active when the club's or organization's membership application has been accepted and all its activities are conducted according to the provisions of the AVA Bylaws and Policies.

1. Active Member Clubs and State Organizations are considered in good standing when all debts, liabilities and obligations to the AVA have been satisfied. They may exercise all the privileges of their respective membership.

2. Active Member Clubs and State Organizations are considered not in good standing when an outstanding debt, liability, and/or obligation has not been satisfied within sixty days of the date due. A Member Club or State Organization not in good standing forfeits all rights and privileges to include the right to conduct or sponsor events. It may not vote in any state, regional or membership meeting of the AVA. Once a Member Club or State Organization has satisfied that outstanding debt, liability and/or obligation it will be considered in good standing. Regional Directors will be given ten days to resolve club deficiencies, or identify extenuating circumstances, before a club is placed in not in good standing status.

Voting Privileges:

Each National Officer, Regional Director, State Organization and Regular Member Club in good standing forty-five (45) days before the opening general session is entitled to one vote in each election and on each matter submitted to a vote of the members. The Executive Director shall have no vote. Delegates: A delegate normally represents each State Organization and Regular Member Club at the General Sessions. Each State Organization and Regular Member Club at the General Sessions. Each State Organization and Regular Member Club at the General Sessions. Each State Organization and Regular Member Club designates its delegate by completing AVA Form 500, Delegate Selection and Proxy Designation, and ensures the designated delegate registers for the Biennial Convention. The AVA National Headquarters will

mail the AVA Form 500 to State Organizations and Regular Member Clubs. Alternates: State Organizations and Regular Member Clubs in good standing may designate an alternate to the Delegate by completing AVA Form 500 and ensuring the designated alternate registers for the Biennial Convention. Proxies: State Organizations and Regular Member Clubs in good standing may vote by proxy by designating a proxy on AVA Form 500. A proxy can only be given to a person certified as a delegate for the Biennial Convention. Candidates for AVA National Office or candidates for Regional Director may not carry proxies. Responsibilities: Delegates, Alternates and Proxies will present their copy of AVA Form 500 to the Credentials Committee at the convention, attend the convention, participate in all general sessions and attend workshops. A club may transfer voting privileges to an alternate only in an emergency.

Other Key Deadlines to Remember:

November 15th, 2018 – The following items are due:

- E-post card must be filed with the IRS and a copy provided to AVA HQ.
- Club's Annual Financial Report is due to the AVA HQ.
- Update of Officers Information in the ESR must be completed by each club.

Clubs Can Now Host AVA Community Events (ACE)!

AVA's new brand of community events is ready for implementation! It is important to emphasize these events are **not sanctioned by the IVV**. Therefore, no reference to the IVV should be published in any materials announcing or advertising these events. Furthermore, clubs should make it very clear there will be no book stamping for participation in ACE events.

ACE events are non-IVV events that were approved by the National Executive Council in September of 2017. This new brand of AVA events was created not to replace IVV events but rather to enhance our current IVV events by allowing clubs the flexibility to create events that are more responsive to local community needs. ACE events are not restricted by IVV event policies and procedures. Clubs now have the **option** to host IVV events as well as AVA ACE events. Clubs are not **re**-**quired** to host ACE events.

TAW Production Changes Effective January 1, 2019

During the June meeting, the National Executive Council voted to reduce production costs of the The American Wanderer (TAW) by as much as 50% as part of the renegotiation of a contract extension with the current publisher in effort to reduce AVA operational expenses. The annual cost of the TAW is approximately \$32,000 to publish and mail 6 issues.

Effective January 1, 2019, the TAW publication will be distributed quarterly instead of bimonthly. This change will save the AVA over \$10,000 per year.

The new 2019 TAW print deadlines will continue to be on the 25th of the month as follows:

January 25, 2019 – For the March Issue (Quarter 1)

April 25, 2019 – For the June Issue (Quarter 2)

July 25, 2019 – For the September Issue (Quarter 3)

October 25, 2019 - For the December Issue (Quarter 4)

With these new deadlines it is very important events get sanctioned 90 days in advance to insure they are printed in the TAW.

Members can still request the TAW in an electronic format, a hard copy or both. The TAW is a membership benefit for all AVA Lifetime and Associate Members.
