AVA BOARD SECRETARY - CECELIA MINER, PH.D.

I hereby notify all AVA National Officers, Regional Directors, State Organizations, and AVA Member Clubs of the 2023 American Volkssport Association Regular Membership Meeting and invite you to participate.

On June 14, 2023, 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. Central Daylight Time, the AVA will hold the Regular Membership Meeting required by AVA Bylaws. The meeting will be held remotely, and the purpose will be to elect officers, to receive reports of officers and committees, and to conduct other business that may arise. Each club will appoint a delegate and an alternate.

Voting Privileges: Each National Officer, Regional Director, State Organization, and Regular Member Club in good standing forty-five days before the Regular Membership Meeting (April 30, 2023) is entitled to one vote in each election and on each matter submitted to a vote of the members. The Executive Director shall have no vote. Because there is only one candidate for each office, voting for officers shall be by acclamation.

Delegates and Alternates: A delegate or designated alternate normally represents each State Organization and Regular Member Club. Because this membership meeting is virtual, the precise means of appointing delegates and alternates will appear in subsequent Checkpoints.

Proxies: State Organizations and Regular Member Clubs in good standing may vote by proxy by using a mail ballot option.

Responsibilities: AVA will track delegates, alternates, and proxies and provide the list to the AVA Secretary for credentialing. A club may transfer voting privileges to an alternate only in an emergency. The club should advise the delegate and alternate on voting positions for elections and other business upon which the membership might vote. Delegates should report back to the club they represent on the Regular Membership Meeting.

IMPORTANT DEADLINES FOR THE JUNE 14, 2023, REGULAR MEMBERSHIP MEETING

March 31, 2023 – Regular Membership Meeting Credentialing Forms will be emailed to all Club Officers on or before this date. If you would like this form to be mailed to you, please contact Erin at erin@ava.org or you may access this form online by clicking here.

April 7, 2023 – Agenda items and proposed Bylaws changes are due to the National Office by 12:00 midnight Central Time. Please send to Nancy Wittenberg at chair@ava.org and copy henry@ava.org.

April 15, 2023 – Agenda and proposed bylaws changes will be emailed to all club officers.

April 30th, 2023 – Deadline for clubs to be in good standing to vote in the Regular Membership Meeting, June 14, 2023.

May 15, 2023 – Officer, Board Member and Committee Chair reports are due. Please limit reports to 300 words. There will not be a printed book of reports. All reports will be posted on the AVA website prior to the meeting under a special tab.

May 24, 2023 – Regular Membership Meeting information packet which includes all reports and supplemental documents are emailed to Officers, Board Members, Committee Chairs, and Club Officers.

May 31, 2023 – Credentialing forms must be received at the National Office by this date. You may mail or email the forms to Marian at marian@ava.org.

June 14, 2023 – AVA Regular Membership Meeting, 5:00 pm – 8:00 pm Central, this will be an electronic meeting utilizing the Zoom online meeting platform. Club Delegates who will be voting must register in advance for the meeting. More information will be in the April and May Checkpoints.

INVITING ALL AVA CLUB MEMBERS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE KING WILLIAM PARADE!

In case you did not get enough of San Antonio, we invite you to come back and participate in the King William Fair Fiesta parade! This festival draws 35,000 visitors to the King William District (one block away from the National Office) and is part of the city's annual Fiesta celebration which draws over 3 million people over the 10 day event to downtown San Antonio.

Due to the success of the Olympiad, in particular the community walk and parade in the King William District, the King William Association has invited the AVA to apply to participate in their annual parade. AVA members who participate will be asked to carry one of the IVV or IML banners and walk a short route of 1.5 miles. Members can bring old medals and pass them out to spectators along the route. *Fiesta is all about the medals!* The parade is on Saturday, April 29, 8:00am – 11am. After the parade, the AVA National Office will host snacks and refreshments at the office for all AVA parade participants.

Although, the application has not been approved yet, it is highly likely we will get accepted! If you would like to participate in the parade, please contact henry@ava.org. Family members and friends are invited to walk in the parade should we not have enough club members. We need approximately 42 participants. Confirmation and more details of this event will be posted on the AVA website and emailed to all who have expressed interest as soon as we have been notified.

REQUESTS FOR ADDITIONAL INSURED CERTIFICATES

Sometimes when a club hosts an event at a park, city, or private facility, the owners will ask to be added to AVA's insurance policy as an Additional Insured. This Additional Insurance Certificate covers outside parties who may have a financial stake in the club event. Clubs do not need to request Additional Insured Certificates for themselves because they are already covered under the AVA's General Liability Policy. Hosting a national convention is a lot of work, beginning with developing a proposal, through planning and delivering the convention experience, but it is well worth the effort in benefiting your walking area, your local clubs and the national organization. Locations considering submitting a proposal can obtain much needed assistance from the National Office, local Sports Commission and Convention Bureau.


