#### **AVA INDIVIDUAL MEMBERSHIP CHANGES**

During the AVA Regular Membership Meeting, Club members voted to Amend our bylaws, replacing Associate members with Individual members and entitling them with most of the same benefits as Club members, including the right to vote. Individuals cannot sanction events, only clubs.

As a result, the Associate membership category no longer exists. The new membership category is AVA Individual Members and includes the following benefits:

- A 10% discount on most AVA merchandise.
- A 10% discount on our National Conventions registration full package and other signature events hosted by the National Office.
- 🛕 An annual subscription to The American Wanderer (TAW), a national walk publication of the AVA.
- 🏂 The opportunity to participate in the Centurion Challenge Program
- **†** Each AVA Individual member is entitled to participate in AVA Membership meetings.
- Each AVA Individual adult (18+ years) member is entitled to one vote on each matter submitted to a vote of the members.

#### URGENT GROUPER UPDATE

The following message was sent in June to all AVA Club POC's regarding Grouper.

"Grouper has sunset the club calendar feature of their offering. You will no longer be able to access your club accounts or submit events through the Grouper system. Our YRE, Seasonal, and Group events will no longer be visible on their website. We were given no explanation from Grouper. While Grouper's program and technology is evolving, we are working with them to understand their future direction and if it presents any opportunities to continue to partner with them for the benefit of all parties involved."

As more information becomes available, we will share it with all Club POC's. If your club is contacted by Grouper, please refer them to the AVA National Office unless your club opts work independently with them. For clubs who were a part of the Grouper RSVP program, payment for the first quarter will be credited to your accounts once we receive it from Grouper.

#### CONVENTION COMMITTEE - JERRY WILSON, CHAIR

#### CONVENTION 2027 PROPOSALS, AND HOW ABOUT 2029

We have three proposals for hosting the 2027 AVA Biennial Convention. Those attending the Gala at the 2025 Convention in Las Cruces NM viewed presentations from these three visitor bureau proposers. Each will be assessed in several areas, among which are:

- Size of facilities to host social events, delegate meetings, vendor booths, convention registration and sports events registration, the AVA Board meeting, etc.
- · Dates available in 2027.
- · Various costs to attendees.
- Various costs to the Association.
- Location related to air travel, interstate roads, hotel/motel/RV accommodations, walk events, swim and biking events, etc.
- Volunteers available from local groups, clubs etc.
- Identifying vehicle and bike rental possibilities for attendees to pursue.

The three destinations in the running are Springfield MO, Norman OK, and Rogers AR. During the AVA Board Meeting held during the Board Retreat, on June 18, I was asked to make four things clear:

- AVA can still entertain a proposal to host the 2027 AVA Biennial Convention from a local club, or multiple clubs. When requested we received no hosting proposals submitted by local clubs. The proposals for the three sites currently on the list came from the visitors bureau from each area. If local clubs are interested please send a proposal as soon as possible, and include as much information as possible as to how a convention of 300 - 600 people could be hosted in your locale.
- If a local club, or multiple clubs are interested in hosting the 2029 AVA Biennial Convention, let's start talking now.

- Tasks assigned to local clubs hosting biennial conventions in their area have been greatly reduced during the last two conventions, also some of the changes to ease the need for local volunteer hours have been realized by adapting practices used during the 2023 IVV Olympiad. The three main areas local clubs would assume the lead are:
  - Sports events: Designing walk and biking (cycling) events, and arranging for a swim event and water stations, as needed
  - Local volunteers are always needed. These volunteers can come from local clubs, civic groups, local
    colleges, or through the local visitors bureau. Volunteers coming to conventions from other areas of
    the nation are encouraged to volunteer some hours.
  - Participate on the Convention Committee.
- Local clubs that develop sports events, walking, biking and swimming, receive a portion of the fees collected for each event. This began in 2021. (Another task the Convention Committee assumed in 2021 was to promote and even register convention walkers for the local club's YR and seasonal events in the area, greatly increasing the number of participants for local events not directly associated with the convention. These participants are treated as if they went to the already existing start box.)

The National Office has assumed the lion's share of tasks and all costs associated with preparing for and holding our national conventions. These tasks include, but are not limited to, agreeing to the convention dates, working closely with the local visitors bureau or sports bureau; and contracting with the convention hotel, convention center, local venues for social events, etc. The Convention Committee also participates in many of these tasks in a review and advisory capacity.





#### AVA 50TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION!! 1976-2026



Planning is underway for AVA's 50<sup>th</sup>. The first IVV sanctioned volksmarch in the United States took place in Fredericksburg, TX, during the celebration of the American Bicentennial in 1976. The event was hosted by the Volkssportverein Friedrichsburg club, AVA-0001, on June 12-13, 1976. The club regularly hosts a "Founders Day" event to honor this first walk in the USA.

The Programs Committee is looking for ideas from our AVA clubs and walkers on ways to celebrate this half-century milestone, which will also coincide with America's 250<sup>th</sup>! We are currently soliciting at least one sanctioned celebratory walk each month in 2026 highlighting each of our 10 AVA regions. Currently celebratory events are scheduled for every month except July, August and November. Look for AVA's 50<sup>th</sup> Celebration Calendar in the very near future on the AVA website!

Between now and June 2026, we also encourage AVA walkers to share their AVA experiences over the past 50 years with our membership by writing an article for TAW or the Checkpoint. #### SPECIAL PROGRAMS TABLE AT AVA'S 23RD BIENNIAL CONVENTION - REPORT

Thank you to all who took the time to stop by the Special Programs table at the AVA Convention in Las Cruces and discuss Special Programs with Frank Sayers, Terry Lunghofer, Terri Tyler and myself.

We had a flip chart where walkers could suggest future special programs and the ideas were very interesting and quite varied. They included: Animal Signs of the Chinese Zodiac; Food Truck Cuisines; Bank/Puzzle Geocaches; Larger than Life (10 ft+) Statues (animals/humans); Outdoor Concerts; Peter Toth Totem Poles; Planets/Heavenly Bodies; Public Art; Same City Name but in 2 different states/countries; Specialized/Personalized License Plates; and Time Capsules.



We also had a clipboard where walkers could recommend past programs they would like to see reactivated. Recommendations included: America's Family Bakeries (2012); College Campus Program (2004); Covered Bridges (2007); Historic Churches (2009); Ice Cream Parlors (2017); I Walked the USA in 10 state increments (precursor to the 50 State SP); National Parks Anniversary (2015); River Walk America (2006); Spirit of Walking/Cemetery Stroll (2006); Walking America's Murals (2012); and Walkin' Waterfalls (2009).

If a club is interested in hosting any of the special program ideas listed above, or re-activating a past special program, or hosting a completely new idea your club has been considering, please contact Diane Howell Evans for details. We are looking for new Special Programs beginning January 1, 2027 and all special program proposals need to be submitted no later than November 1, 2025, to the Programs Committee.

#### YEAR ROUND AND SEASONAL EVENT RENEWALS FOR 2026

The renewal of 2025 Year Round and Seasonal events (YRE/SEs) for 2026 was enabled on June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025. Clubs are expected to complete the renewal of their 2026 YRE/SEs as well as any new YRE/SEs for 2026 by 8/31/2025.

NOTE: Clubs should **NOT** use the "New event - copy previous" feature in the Edit/New "NEW EVENTS TO BE COMPLETED" section to renew YRE/SEs.

On June 1<sup>st</sup>, the my.ava.org system copied the current (published) event information of each club's sanctioned 2025 YRE/SEs into the Edit/New event buffer. These copied events are listed in the "EVENT RENEWALS" section of the club's Edit/New page (found via the club's home page, then clicking on the "Sanctions" tab, then the "Edit/New" tab).

Any unpublished or unapproved changes to 2025 YRE/SEs was **NOT** included in the event information copied on June 1<sup>st</sup>. The club's home page contains a "Edit/New Sanctioning Summary" table providing a count of events needing to be published or approved. Any club YRE/SEs listed in the Edit/New "**EDITING CURRENT SANCTIONS**" section may have unpublished/unapproved changes. Clicking on the "Review" button, for a listed event, displays all event information with change bars indicating what changes are still pending. Clicking on the displayed "Publish (make public)" or "Req Approval" button near the top of the Review page will apply changes to the 2025 event only (after RD approval if needed).

After June 1<sup>st</sup>, you may import any published/approved changes in a 2025 YRE/SE to the corresponding 2026 YRE/SE pending renewal by clicking on renewal's "**Reload 2025**" button. Note, reloading the 2025 event will overwrite any changes made to the corresponding 2025 pending renewal event.

On June 1st, all published 2025 YRE/SE information was copied into 2026 pending renewal events (including the 2025 PPSF setting) with the following exceptions:

- 1. The event year was changed to 2026.
- 2. Special Programs (SPs), that "expire" 12/31/2025, were removed. (The SP expiration date is the date after which the SP POC will no longer officially accept completed SP books, as indicated on the current SPs web page, https://cb.ava.org/specprog.php)
- 3. The requested number of stamps for each renewal was set to 1 for PSB and PSB/OSB events and 0 for OSB events. (The previous year's stamp request number is ignored. The first stamp for any event type is always free.)

Clubs may also choose to mark any listed renewal as "Do Not Renew". Clubs should either request approval or mark as "Do Not Renew" each 2026 pending renewal event by the 8/31/2025 deadline.

For an event the club chooses to renew, a club manager should click on the listed renewal's "**Edit**" button. Then inspect/update the information displayed on the Edit page by clicking on each of the "Sanction Tiles" buttons near the top of the page. In particular, the club should consider possibly checking off "Request event be PPSF", adding any applicable/new SPs (starting in 2026, see <a href="https://cb.ava.org/futureprog.php">https://cb.ava.org/futureprog.php</a>), and adjusting the number of requested stamps. Once a renewal's information has been edited and saved, a "Review" page displays all the renewal's information on one page. Clubs must click on the "Req Approval" button (near the top of the "Review" page) to indicate the renewal is ready for regional director (and state association if applicable) approval.

New YRE/SEs for 2026 should also be submitted for approval before August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025, to assure their inclusion in the 2026 Starting Point book. Clubs may use the Edit/New page features in the "NEW EVENTS TO BE COMPLETED" and "RESURRECT AN OLD YRE / SEASONAL" sections to create new YRE/SEs as described via the "Help" button on the Edit/New page.

It's time to pre-order your 2026 Starting Point Book. The deadline is no later than midnight, September 30, 2025. This year, due to increased costs of printing and less books being ordered, the price has gone up to \$35.00 per book plus shipping and handling. If we see a decline in interest in ordering this year, this may be the last year we produce a paper book and instead consider creating an electronic version. #### YEAR ROUND EVENT RENEWALS

The Year Round Event (YRE) renewal process will begin June 1, 2025 and will end August 31, 2025.

To start the process, Clubs should go to their "Sanctions" tab, "Edit/New" tab and then to the "Event Renewal" section, where they will find a list of all of their 2025 YRE/SEs ready to be edited and reviewed for 2026.





On the renewal's review page, they will have the option to request approval or indicate the YRE/SE will not be renewed for 2026. Clubs should NOT use the "Copy" feature in the "New Events to be Completed" section to sanction an existing 2025 YRE/SE for 2026.

Regional Directors must review and approve all events by September 15, 2025 in order to get them into the 2026 Starting Point book. Any approvals after the 15th do not guarantee a section in the 2026 Starting Point book.

#### IS LABOR DAY WEEKEND A FEST WEEKEND IN THE MID-AMERICA REGION?

If there were ever a weekend to be identified as a Fest Weekend, but was not, it is Labor Day Weekend in the Mid-America Region.

For many years, the Clubs of Indiana and Michigan have offered outstanding events beginning with the last Saturday of August in Auburn, Indiana, and culminating with the Mackinaw Bridge Walk on Labor Day. The trip from Auburn to Mackinaw is packed with interesting and enjoyable Seasonal and Year-Round Events to make this a memorable weekend.





This year the Three Rivers Strollers will continue its annual Auburn Duessey walking event in Auburn, Indiana, on Saturday, August 30. The event can only be described as fantastic, as it is orchestrated with the town's annual Auburn, Cord & Duesenberg (ACD) festival, which celebrates Auburn's history as a major producer of the finest cars ever manufactured in the United States. Along the routes you will encounter and experience the pride of Auburn, as it is displayed in the downtown, neighborhoods and museums. The culminating event of the weekend is the Michigan Pathfinder walking event on Monday, September 1, in conjunction with the annual Mackinaw Bridge Walk, when the more than five mile long bridge is closed down for six hours of only pedestrian traffic, which is otherwise prohibited. In fact, it may be the only event in the United States or Canada, where Volksporters represent less than one percent of the more than 35,000 pairs of feet on the Bridge at one time.
