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AVA WALK APPLICATION

The AVA's walk application is in the "pre-development" phase. A project manager has been contracted to help recruit and onboard a qualified UI/UX researcher and designer. The project manager will work with this individual on defining or selecting one primary persona, creating exploratory wireframes, and conducting research sprints for up to 20 user interviews to validate assumptions and feature value for a Minimum Viable Product (MVP). This phase of the work does not include software design or development beyond wireframes and is expected to take up to 180 hours or 4 1/2 weeks. The projected cost is \$30,000. Because consultants are paid on an hourly basis the cost could be more or less, depending on changes requested by the AVA.

The AVA's Finance Chair, CEO, and Board Members will work collaboratively to implement a strategic funding plan that supports the development of the AVA's walk application. This effort will leverage grants, sponsorships, corporate partnerships, and individual contributions to achieve a campaign goal of \$600,000. These resources will be invested in both the development and targeted marketing of the app to ensure its long-term success and sustainability. FINANCIAL HEALTH TIPS FOR LOCAL CLUBS

From the Desk of the National Finance Chair

Finances don't have to be complicated. These quick tips are designed to help your club stay organized, avoid common mistakes, and keep things running smoothly.

Donor Intent Matters

If a donor gives for a specific purpose, you must honor that. Track restricted funds separately to maintain trust and compliance. Mismanaging these funds can damage your reputation and even lead to legal issues.

Quick Start Checklist:

- ✓ Create a column for restricted funds in your spreadsheet
- ✓ Label donations clearly
- ✓ Report back to donors on use

Bonus: How to Attract Donors

Building trust with donors starts with transparency and communication. When donors see that their contributions are used as intended, they're more likely to give again—and tell others about your organization.

3 Ways to Start Soliciting Donors:

- ✓ Tell Your Story: Share why your club matters and the impact donations make.
- ✓ Start Small: Ask for modest contributions tied to specific needs (e.g., "\$25 helps us fund a community event").
- ✓ Show Gratitude: Thank donors promptly and share updates on how their gift was used.

2026 TEXAS TRAIL ROUNDUP

We are just one month away from the 2026 Texas Trail Roundup! Join us for one, two, or all three days of fun, health, history, culture, and community. Each year, walkers from around the world come together to explore one of America's most historic and culturally rich cities on foot. Whether you are an experienced walker or just starting out, we welcome you to explore with us!



On day one February 20, we will have our 50th Anniversary Walk in Fredericksburg, Texas. The Opening Ceremony will start at 9am under the Adelsverein covered pavilion at the Marktplatz. After the walk, we will have live music, a free wine tasting from Augusta Vin, beer samples from Altstadt Brewery, and a food truck for all of our walkers.

On day two, February 21, walkers can choose between completing a 5k, 10k, Half and Full Marathon Walk through the heart of San Antonio, followed by a fun social gathering on South Alamo Street with free goodies from Churrostar, along with a tequila tasting from Surtierra Tequila, and a beautiful performance from Mexican folklórico group, Danzantes de San Antonio.

On day three, February 22, walkers can choose between a 5k, 10k, and Half Marathon Walk through the veins and soul of San Antonio's River Walk area. The finish line and closing ceremony are opening at the Beethoven Maennerchor, which will only be open for our guests.

USING SOCIAL MEDIA FOR YOUR AVA CLUB: FACEBOOK

Facebook went public in 2006. That means that social media is now 20 years old technology. It's coin of the realm. Yet less than ½ of our AVA clubs (42%) have a FB page. If your club does not – consider starting one now, during the 50th Anniversary year. Here are some tips for new or existing club pages!



Getting Started

Facebook (FB) is FREE. It's the biggest, easy to start, and - our target audience (50+) have largely taken it over – so, it reaches who we want to reach. First, you'll need to create your own account. Once you have one, there are two basic constructs for a club Facebook presence.

1. You can create a FB "Group" – [Facebook Help Center](#)

You can create or join a group for anything — stargazing, baking, parenting — with people across the globe or across the street. Groups can be public or private. Don't make your club private! You want people to see your posts and interact with you.

2. Or you can create a "Page" – [Create a Facebook Page | Facebook Help Center](#)

FB Pages are for businesses, brands, and organizations. I like the "page" construct for a club as a non-profit business, and it gives you some additional tools. A FB page or group is connected to YOU, but with a page you will have "two" sites – your personal and your business page and you must "toggle" between them – to either post as yourself or as the business.

Our weekend starts Saturday in Johnstown with a new 5k walk, parade and reenactment of the Patriots storming Johnson Hall. AVA 50TH ANNIVERSARY PASSPORT VS. 2026 ANNIVERSARY HURRAH SPECIAL PROGRAM - WHICH ONE SHOULD I BE USING FOR WHAT?

The "AVA 50th Anniversary Commemorative Passport" is used to record the special stickers available at each of the seventeen (17) AVA 50th Anniversary Signature Events which can be found at the link [50th Anniversary – AVA](#). The Passport costs \$15.00 each plus \$1.50 for shipping and handling and is purchased from National Headquarters. If you haven't purchased your Passport yet, the order form with the information for purchasing a book can be found at the following link: https://cb.ava.org/checkpoint/2025/Oct/Passport_Book_Form.pdf.

Each of the seventeen 50th Anniversary Signature events will have one unique sticker just for their one day or multiple day event which can be earned by walking just one of their signature events. These stickers are only available at the signature event you are attending. If you forget to collect the unique sticker at the event you attended, be aware you will not be able to collect it at any of the other AVA 50th Anniversary Signature Events. Each signature event is receiving ONLY the unique sticker designed for their event!

So, collect a unique sticker at each signature event for your Passport. Complete at least 8 signature events and earn a 50th Anniversary commemorative t-shirt or complete all 17 signature events and receive a 50th Anniversary commemorative t-shirt and an AVA tote bag! Program runs from 1-1-26 to 12-31-26. Submit your completed Passport to National Headquarters or you may scan the completed book, cover to cover, to marian@ava.org by June 31, 2027.



The new 2026 "Anniversary Hurrah Special Program (SP)" is used to record any event that celebrates AVA's 50th Anniversary or America's 250th Anniversary. The qualifiers are of your own choice. Terry Lunghofer, SP POC, has written several articles for both the Checkpoint and TAW, describing the special program. The article also includes information on how to order an Anniversary Hurrah SP book or you may also check out the AVA Special Programs webpage for information on not only the new 2026 SP but all the additional active SPs at: cb.ava.org/specprog.php.

Can I use the Anniversaries Hurrah SP booklet to record any or all of the seventeen AVA 50th Anniversary Signature Events? Yes, of course - but remember in the special program booklet you are using the IVV Certification Stamp to record your completion of the event, not one of the unique stickers mentioned previously. Also, upon completion of the Anniversary Hurrah SP your award is an embroidered patch reflecting the national geography highlighted in the song "America the Beautiful" not an AVA 50th Anniversary souvenir.

As Terry mentions in his article one can determine their own sub-programs to celebrate AVA's and America's history if they are so inclined, but it is NOT a requirement. After months of considering possible sub-programs, I finally arrived at the following for my own self-defined qualifiers: 5 events where one of the first one hundred AVA clubs, which is still in existence, is celebrating AVA's 50th or their own club anniversary; 5 YREs of the first 100 sanctioned YREs still in existence today; 5 events showcasing major US achievements including a July 4th event on the east coast; 5 AVA convention cities; and 1 event for each Special Program from the past that I missed (Murals, Covered Bridges, Volcanoes, Cities in Songs and the Underground Railroad).

I would really be interested in what others are doing – write an article for an upcoming TAW or submit a posting on AVA's Facebook page! Terry said it best, "Each of us has our own sense of the history that we wish to celebrate."

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR AVA 50TH ANNIVERSARY SIGNATURE EVENTS

It is time to celebrate AVA's 50th! Seventeen events are happening across the U.S., and some are hosted by very small Volkssport clubs who answered National's call to celebrate AVA's 50th, showcase their region and promote our organization both locally, state-wide and nationally. These clubs are going to need assistance with everything from registration to checkpoints to walking with new participants to trail sweeping and maybe even more depending on the location. If you are attending any of the seventeen events and would like to help, please let me know by e-mailing me your full name, event you are planning to attend, and both phone and e-mail information to: Programs@ava.org.

You don't need to specify a position, date, or time right now as we are currently collecting information from the host clubs on the dates, type of positions and shifts needed. Once we have all the information about a club's event, we will be using SignUpGenius to list the event and volunteer positions needed. Once the club event information is entered and confirmed in the system, we will send out a link for SignUpGenius so you can sign up for both a position and time that fits your schedule.

Since these events occur over the next 12 months, clubs are still in the planning stages of their anniversary event scheduled for later in the year so look for the monthly Checkpoints, quarterly TAW issues or e-mail blasts from National or the Programs Committee to indicate new events needing volunteers.

GUADALUPE MOUNTAINS NATIONAL PARK

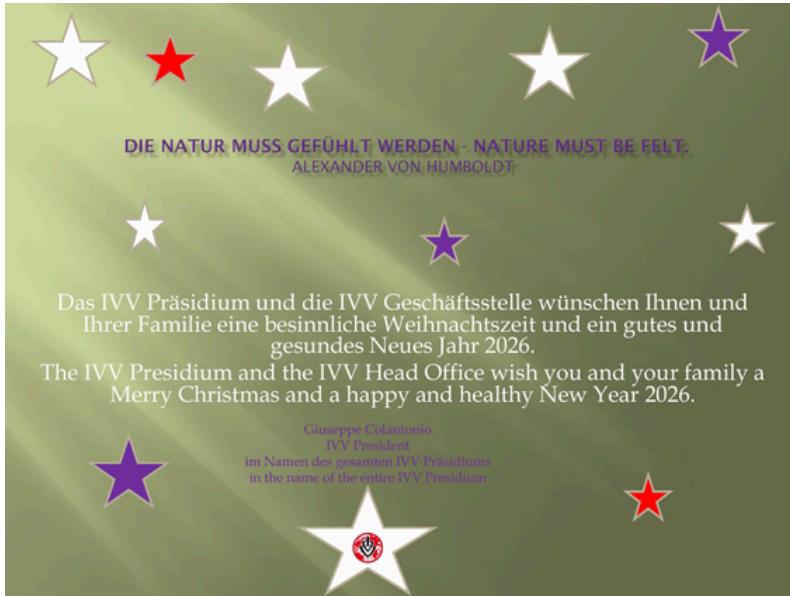

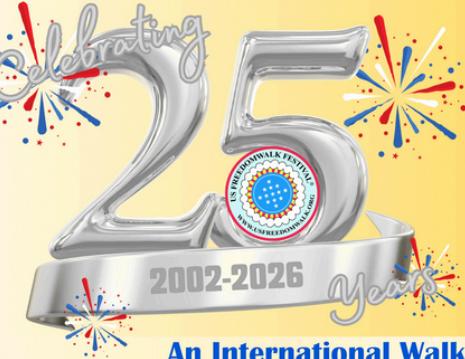
